Moral Turpitude Law & Legal Definition

Moral turpitude refers generally to conduct that shocks the public conscience.

Conviction of crimes of moral turpitude may also disqualify someone from an employment opportunity. The precise definition of a crime that involves moral turpitude isn't always precise, but the following crimes are always considered crimes of moral turpitude:

- murder;
- voluntary manslaughter;
- rape;
- statutory rape;
- domestic violence;
- prostitution;
- fraud and crimes where fraud is an element
- all theft offenses (but see receipt of stolen property below); **INCLUDES: BURGLARY**
- blackmail; **GRAND LARCENY**
- malicious destruction of property; **PETT LARCENY**
- arson; **EMBEZZLEMENT**
- alien smuggling;
- harboring a fugitive;
- bribery;
- perjury
